



Sermon-based small groups connect the week to the weekend!

Dig deeper into the talk each week, while getting connected, cared for, and known. Challenge yourself to see how the message actually makes sense and applies to your everyday life and do it with people just like you to support you on your journey.

Message Info: Who Am I? 6/26/22 – Who am I? Have you ever asked that question before? Do you ever feel like you have a hard time understanding who you are? It's not an easy thing to do. It's easy to view ourselves through the lens of other people, through the devil's lens, and even through our own lens. We can sometimes struggle to understand our true identity. Moses also asked the "who am I" question. He had a hard time seeing himself in the same way God did, and so do we sometimes. We need to put on God's Glasses and see ourselves in the same way He does! (*Passages: Exodus 3:1-4:18, Matthew 4:1-11, Romans 6:22, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Philippians 4:6, Romans 8:28, Psalm 139:13-14, Ephesians 2:10, 1 Peter 2:9, Romans 5:8*)

Discussion Questions: Take your time and dig into these questions.

If you had to use three words to describe yourself, what would they be?

Sometimes we define ourselves by what other people say about us or by the lies that the devil throws at us. We need to see ourselves in the same way God does to understand our true identity. Why is this such a hard thing to do?

Read Exodus 3:9-12. What sticks out to you in these verses? Have you ever asked that same question Moses asked: Who am I?

Moses doubted his capability. Why is it so easy for us to give into doubt? What are some causes? Also, could you share a time you may have battled with doubt?

Read Exodus 4:10. Moses was focused on his weakness, being his ability to speak. What weaknesses do you have that God can work through?

Read the following verses: Romans 6:22, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Exodus 3:12, Psalm 139:13-14, Ephesians 2:10, 1 Peter 2:9, Romans 5:8. Which verse stuck out to you?

God sees us as not defined by our sin, not alone, uniquely designed, having purpose, and loved. Which of these hits you the hardest and why?
