



## Sermon-based small groups connect the week to the weekend!

Dig deeper into the talk each week, while getting connected, cared for and known. Challenge yourself to see how the message actually makes sense and applies to your everyday life and do it with people just like you to support you on your journey.

**Message Info:** Stay Humble, 8/21/22 - Stay humble...it sounds trendy and there are motivational posts all over social media preaching the stay "humble message", but humility isn't really trending in our world today. In fact it seems like what we see more and more of is Pride. Humility isn't putting yourself down it is seeing yourself in your proper place. Deeply valued but not the center of the universe. Restoration in your life or relationships starts simple: Be more humble. (*Passages: 1 Peter 5:6-10; 2 Kings 5:1-19; Philippians*)

**Discussion Questions:** Take your time and dig into these questions.

When you think of humility what name comes to mind? Who is someone who seems really humble to you? Why did you pick that person?

Read 1 Peter 5:6. What sticks out to you about this verse? Why does that stick out to you?

Do you think humility really leads to greater things in your life? Why or why not?

Read 2 Kings 5:1-19. What sticks out to you about this passage? Why does that stick out?

Pastor Josh pulled 4 lessons out of the story of Naaman about pride and humility. 1 - Pride places you as a roadblock for the good God has for you, but humility clears the path for God to do more. 2 - Pride always costs you more than you are willing to pay, but humility delivers more than you were expecting. 3 - Pride leads to more pain and conflict, but humility leads to healing. 4 - Pride perpetuates the fall, but humility leads to healing. Do any of these lessons resonate with you? Why or why not?

Can you see any of the above lessons playing out in your life? Can you tell us how?

Read Philippians 2:3-11. What can you pull from this passage that would help us be more humble?
